Ongoing Projects

- The @Fire IEC has currently been postponed until Nov 2021 due to the pandemic.
- Classification team to be confirmed by INSARAG Secretariat.
- This first Light USAR Classification will help shape the classification process for future Light USAR IEC assessments (eg. GEA, SARAID)
- Review of Light USAR Classification following the first IEC to confirm assurance standards and to record any learnings for future consideration;
- Future LTWG meeting (Virtual) planned prior to the November IEC.

Regional Technical Working Group Updates – Medical WG

Work done

- **Joint Statement issued by the INSARAG MWG and the World Health Organisation (WHO) Emergency Medical Team (EMT) Initiative, welcomed by the ISG on 4 May 2021.**
 - In order to remain effective, response teams must **emphasize internal activities that support their continuity of mission** (resilience) and safety of team members and populations they serve.
 - Encourages COVID-19 vaccination
- **COVID-19 Deployment Technical Reference Note**
 - Document is intended to provide updated information to USAR teams seeking to enhance their field operations in the SARS CoV2 virus (COVID-19) environment.
 - In order to remain mission-ready, teams need to strike the balance, in a rapidly evolving environment, that enables them to achieve the two primary goals of:
 - **Protecting their workforce**
 - **Maintaining operational capability and respond as required**

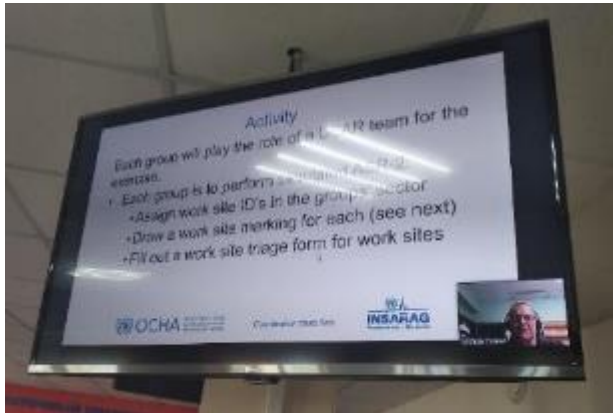

 - MWG members are directly engaged in prevention of transmission and clinical management Covid-19
 - Emerging scientific evidence will be incorporated into MWG technical reference notes as required
- **Review of potential additional Covid-19 risk mitigation measures - Current**
 - In addition to the established risk mitigation measures, e.g., physical distancing, hand hygiene, wearing of masks, regular health checks, explore additional measures that could potentially be employed to increase surveillance, e.g.:
 - Rapid Antigen Testing (RAT)
- **EMT Spinal Cord Injury Guidelines - Current**
 - MWG contributing to the drafting of the pre-hospital section of the EMT Spinal Cord Injury Guidelines

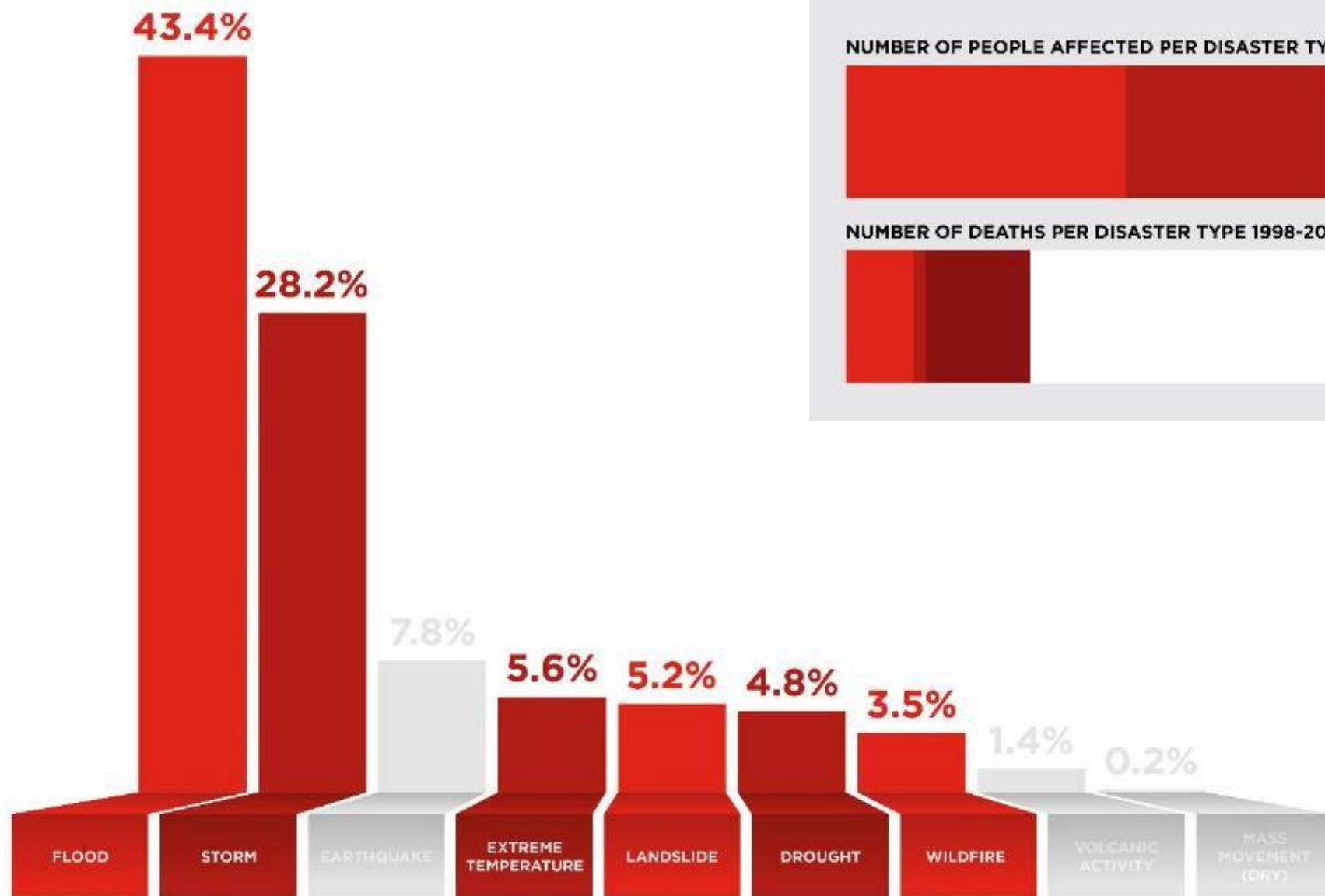

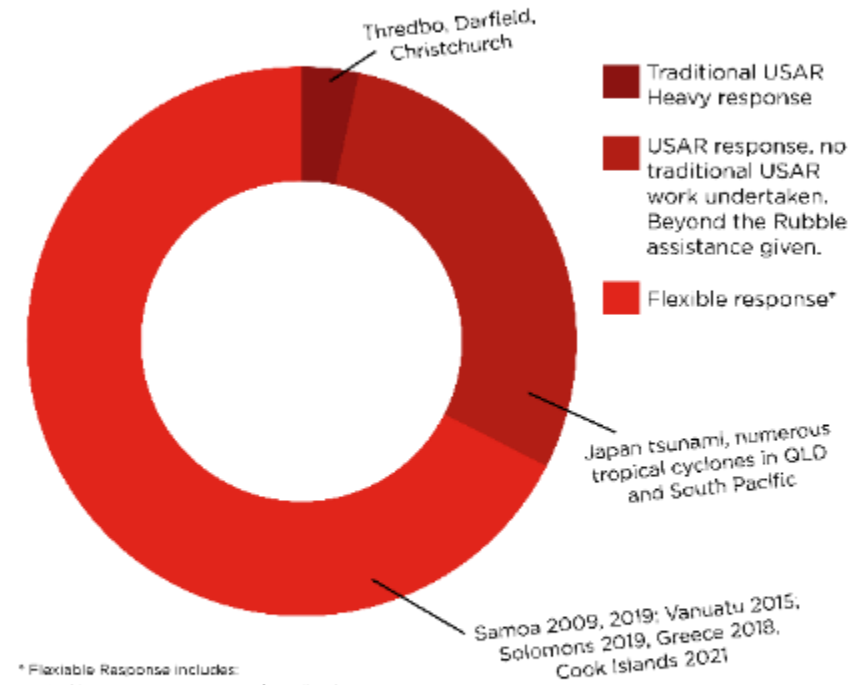


NUMBERS OF DISASTERS PER TYPE 1998-2017

Session 2 - IRNAP Recap

National Accreditation Process (NAP)

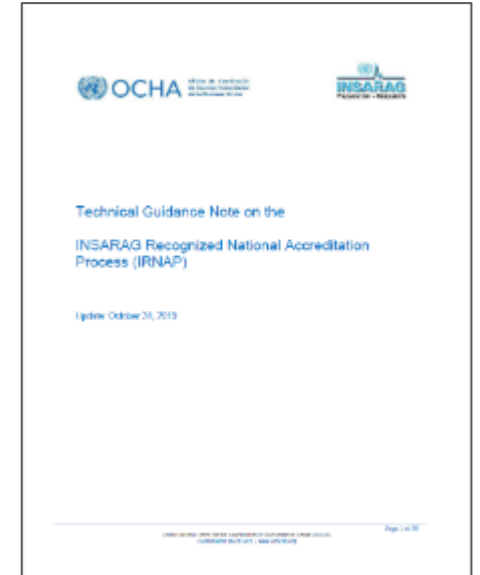
A standardised framework for national authorities to manage, monitor and certify local USAR teams through nationally-recognised standards for local USAR deployments.

INSARAG Recognised NAP (IRNAP)

A NAP that is aligned with the INSARAG Standards can be recognised through the INSARAG External Support and Recognition Process (IESRP) as an IRNAP. Consists of a Support Phase (by TSG) and a Recognition Phase (by TRG)

INSARAG External Classification/Reclassification (IEC/R)

A voluntary, independent, peer-review process which establishes verifiable operational standards designed for teams that have the mandate and institutional support for international USAR deployments.

- Minimum 2 years tenure

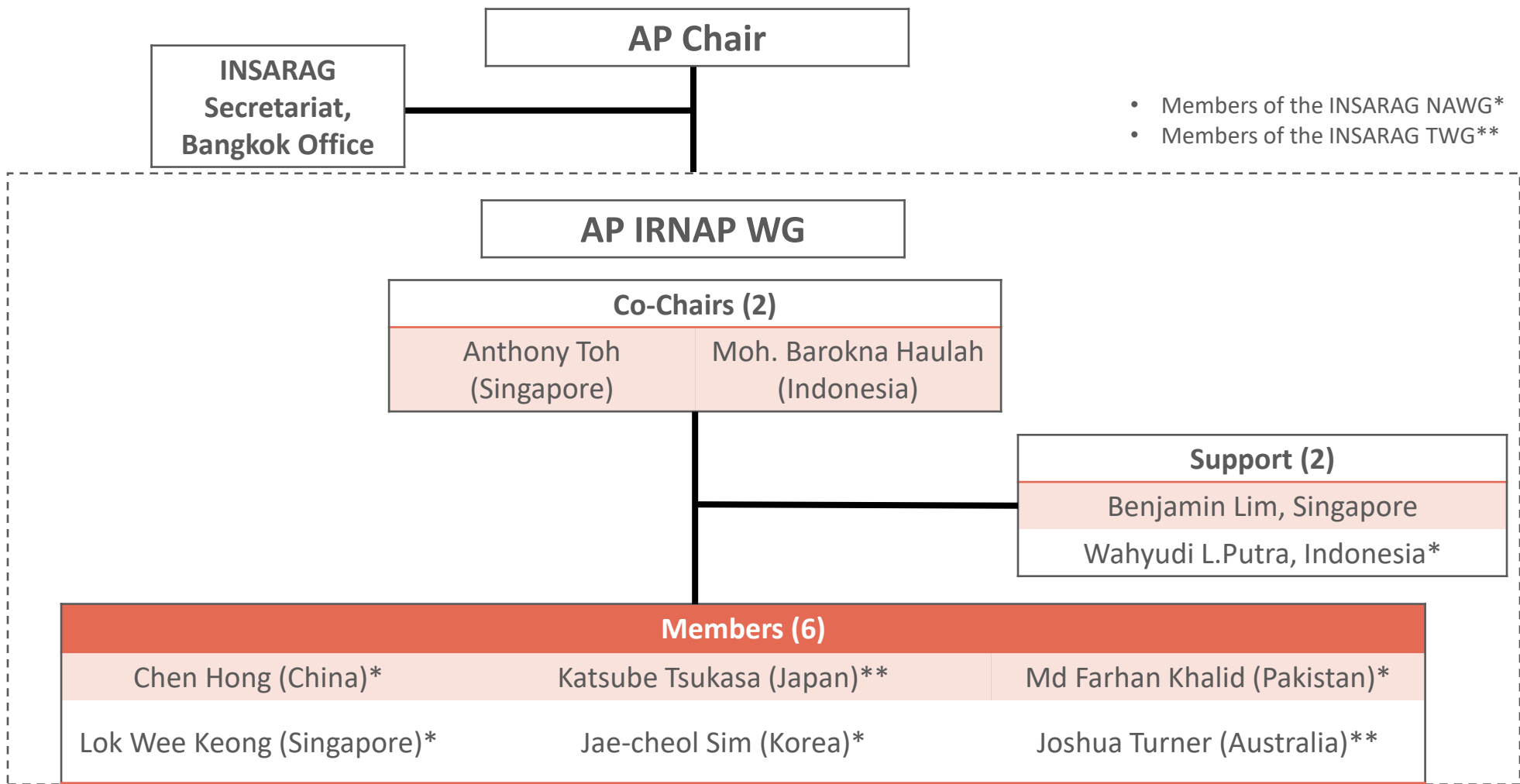

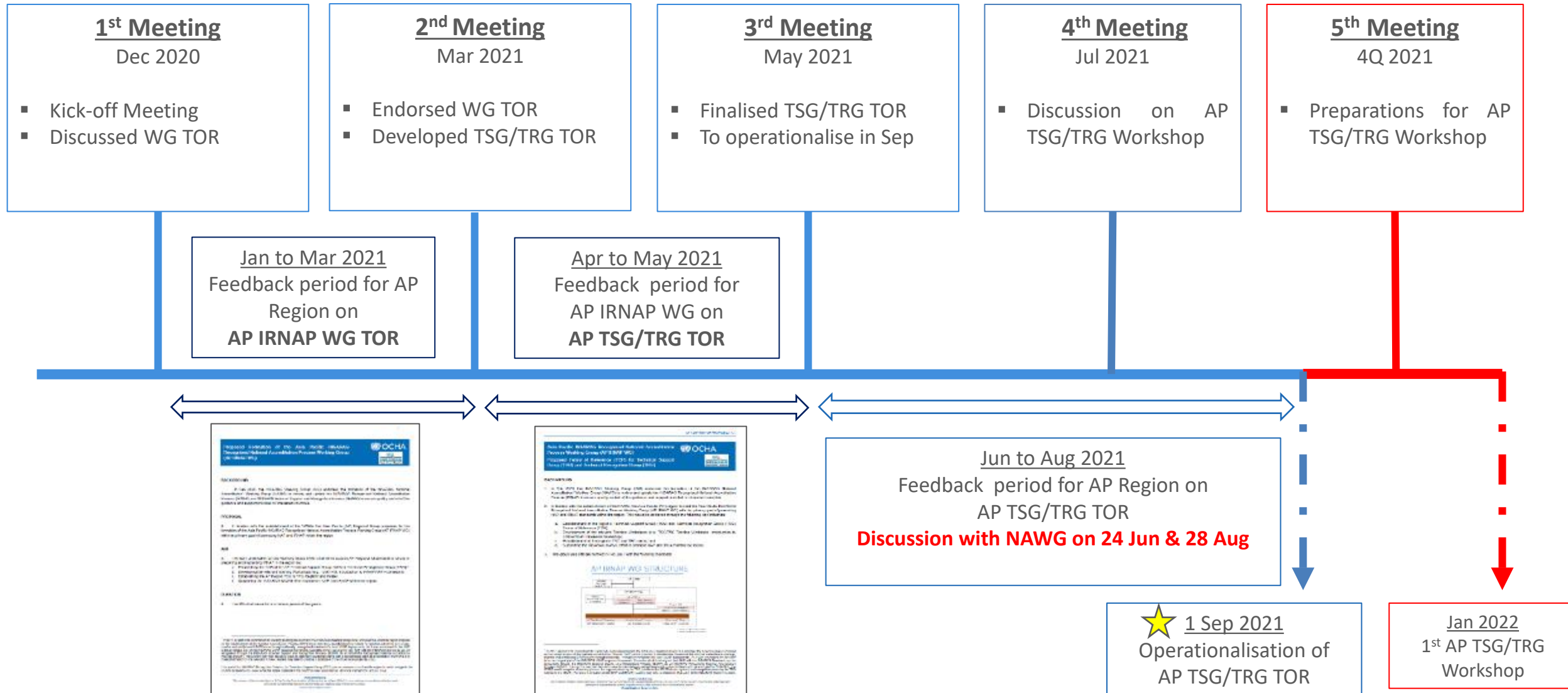

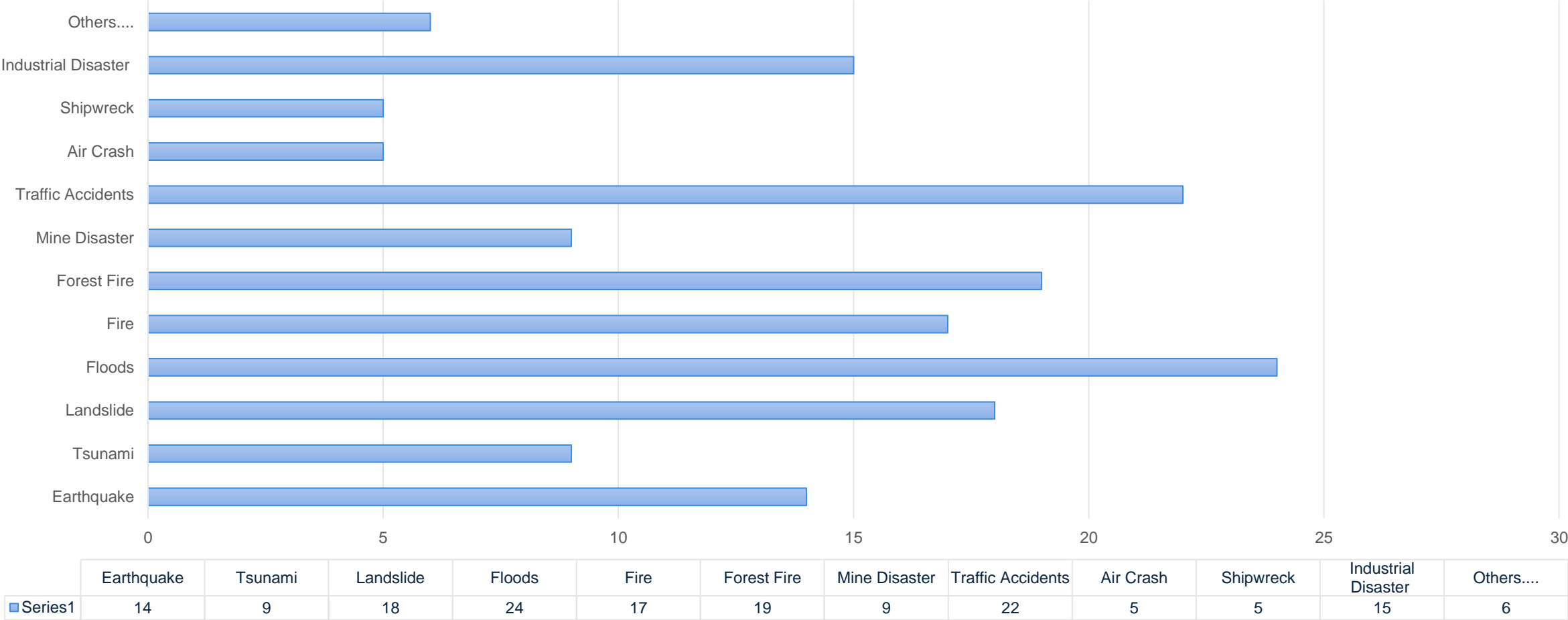

What types of disaster do frequently occur in your country?

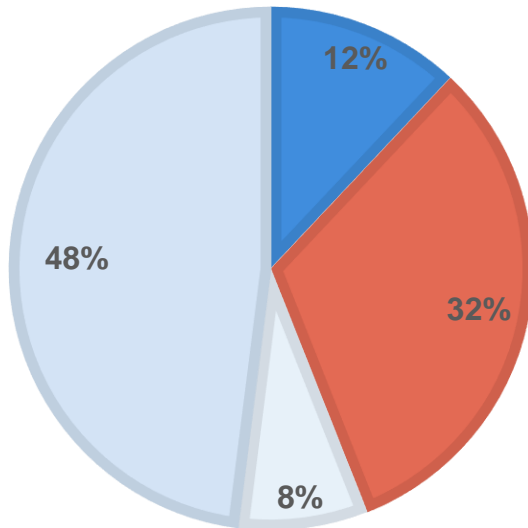

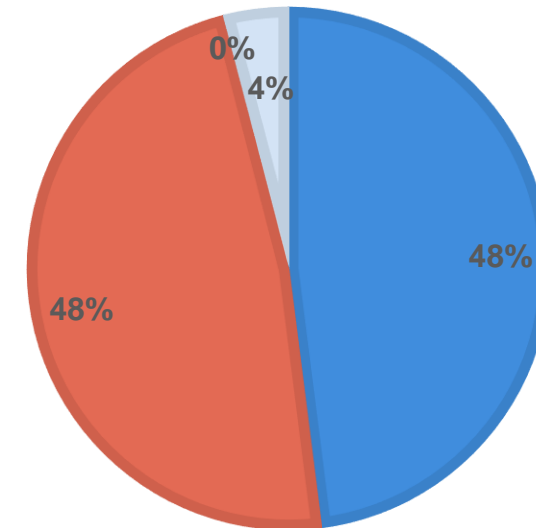
HOW MANY TIMES DOES YOUR

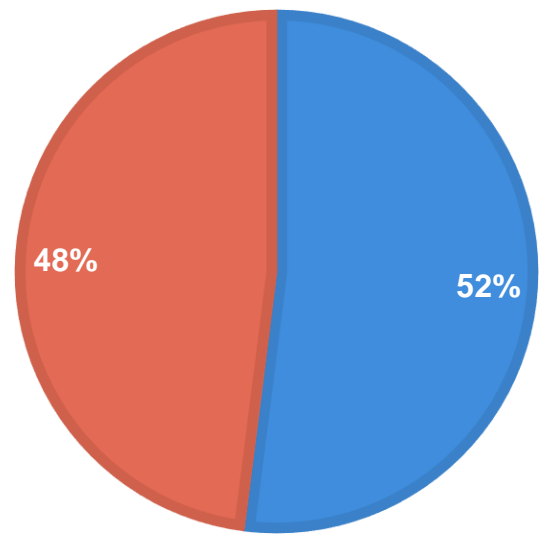

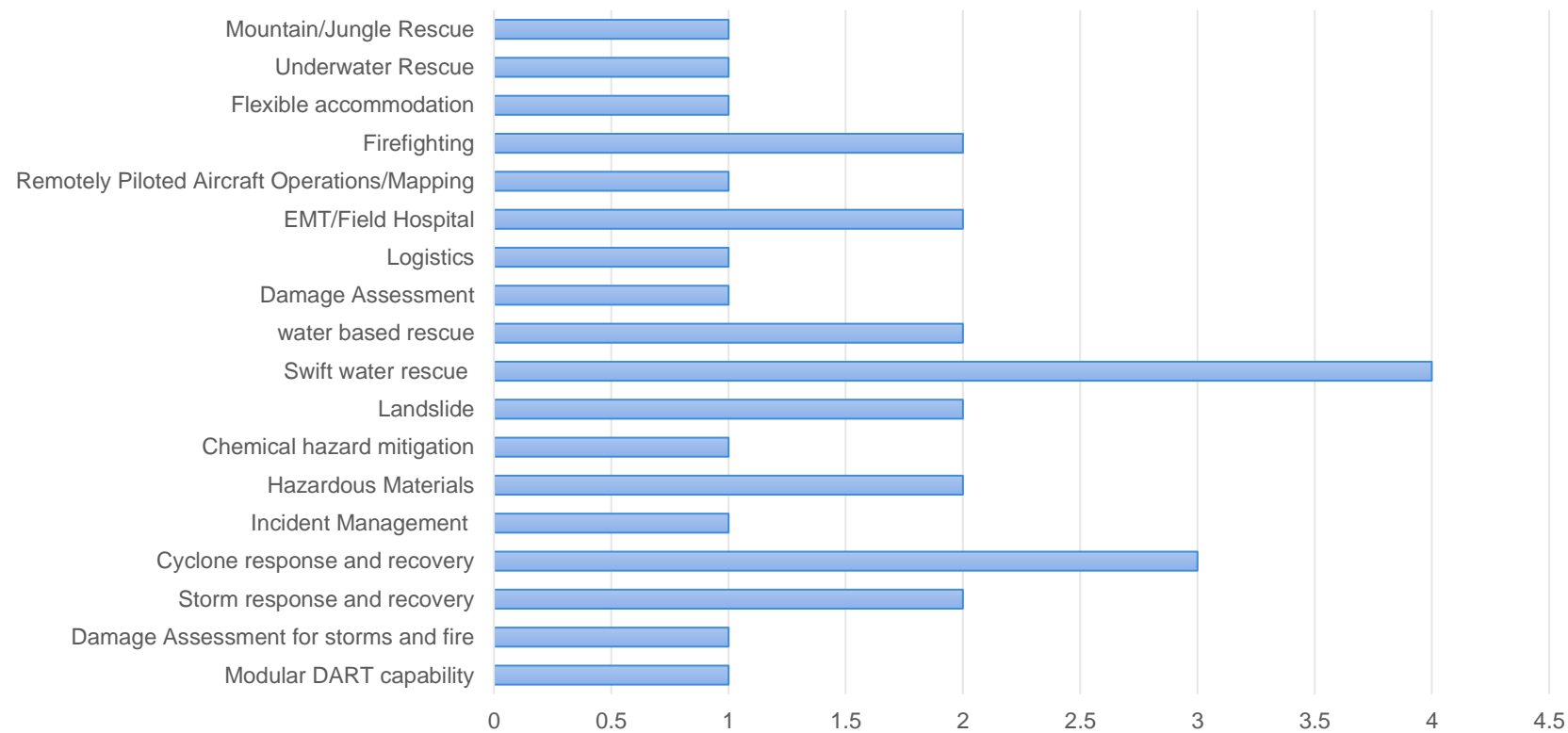

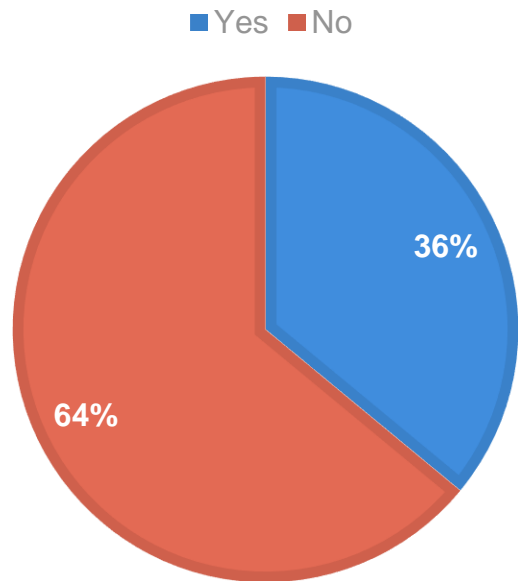
Additional Capabilities Beyond USAR



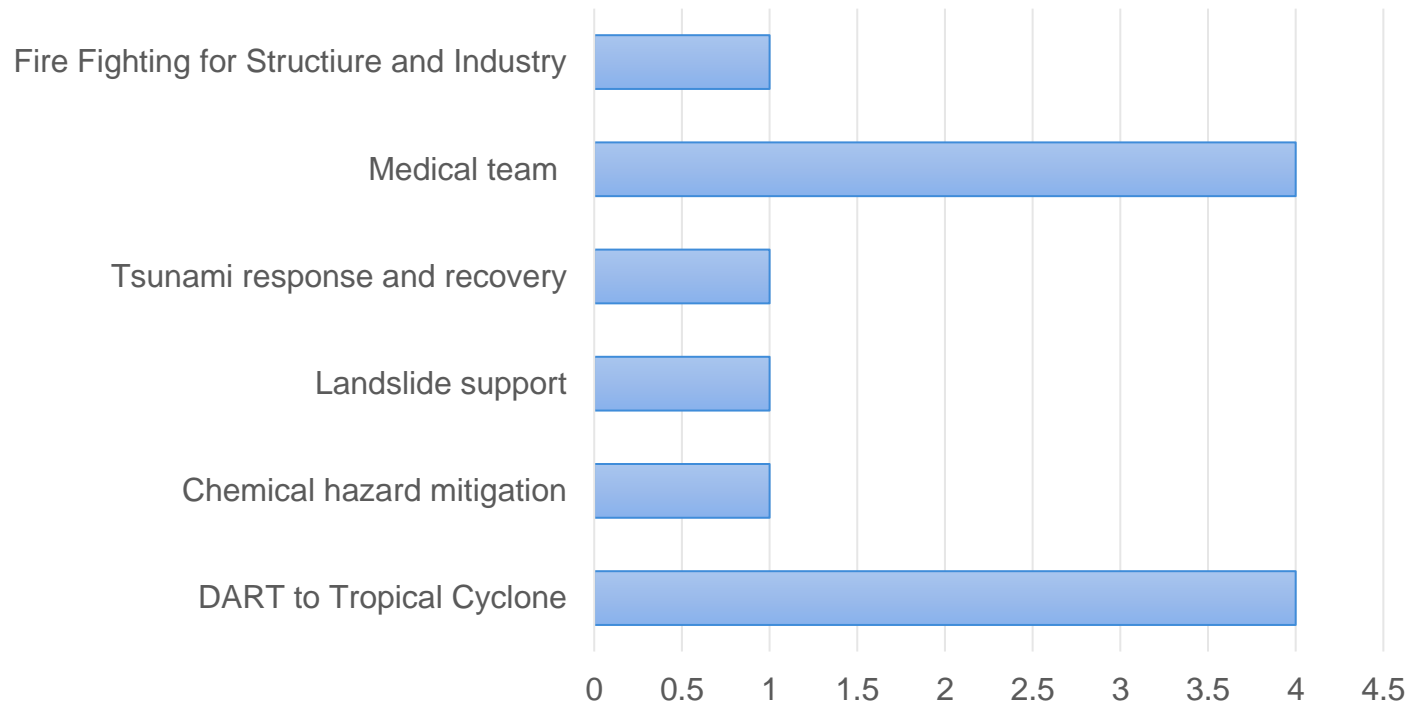

Beyond USAR Capacities Deployed Overseas

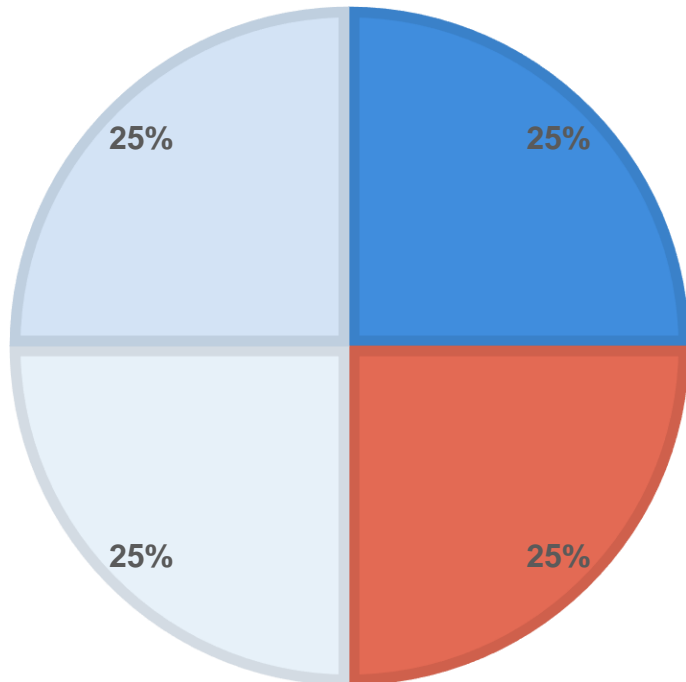

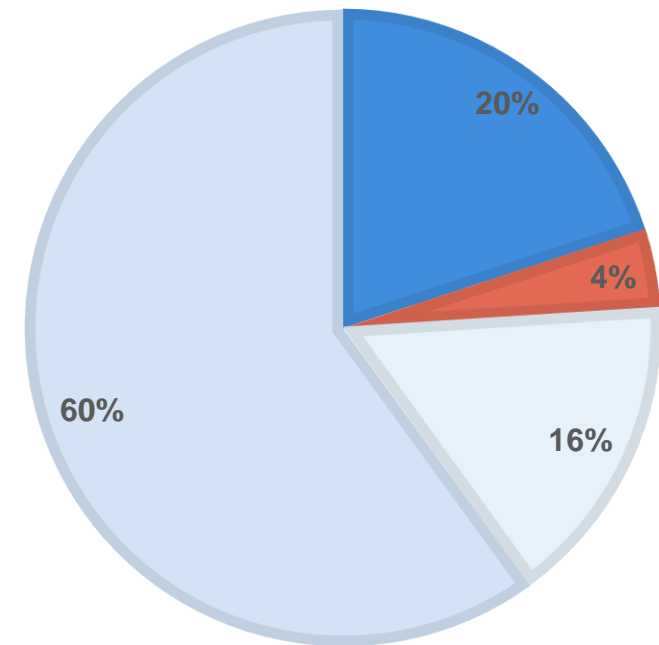

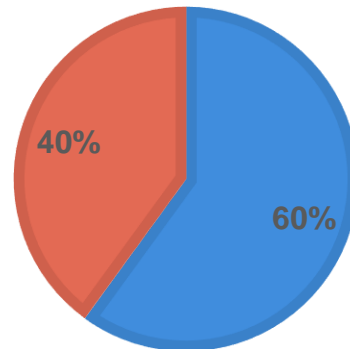
WHAT KIND OF RESOURCES DOES YOUR TEAM HAVE TO SUPPORT THE ADDITIONAL CAPABILITIES?

■ Trained Personnel ■ Equipments ■ Others



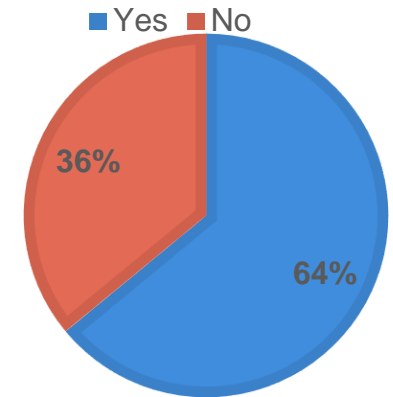
